Hockey fans hoping for an early blockbuster between India and Pakistan at the Asian Games 2026 will have to wait, with the two traditional rivals drawn in separate pools for the continental showpiece. The draw, announced on Friday, places defending champions India in Pool A alongside hosts Japan, South Korea, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Indonesia, while Pakistan headline Pool B with Malaysia, China, Oman, Uzbekistan and Thailand.

The draw means an India-Pakistan encounter can take place only in the semi-finals or the medal matches, provided both teams advance beyond the group stage.

India eyes successful title defence

Led by Harmanpreet Singh, India will arrive in Aichi-Nagoya as the defending champions after winning the gold medal at the Hangzhou Asian Games 2023, where they defeated Japan in the final to secure a record-extending fourth title and qualify directly for the Paris Olympics. This year's tournament

carries added significance, with the men's champions earning direct qualification for the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games.

Women's team targets golden return

In the women's competition India have been placed in Pool B with Japan, Thailand, Singapore, Indonesia and Uzbekistan.

Pool A features China, South Korea, Malaysia, Kazakhstan, Chinese Taipei and Bangladesh. The Indian women's team, which claimed bronze at the Hangzhou Asian Games, will be aiming to improve on that performance and secure its first Asian Games gold since 1992, while also boosting its bid to return to the Olympic stage after missing qualification for Paris 2024.

70% of head & neck cancer cases detected late: HNCII

The institute launched a nationwide campaign to create awareness about early warning signs and the need for timely screening

As many as 70% of head and neck cancer cases in India are diagnosed at an advanced stage, the Head & Neck Cancer Institute of India (HNCII) has said. Adding that this leads to poorer survival, more complex treatment and higher medical costs.

Head and neck cancers account for nearly 30% of all cancers in India, with tobacco use responsible for the majority of cases. HNCII has

launched a nationwide awareness campaign urging people to seek timely diagnosis and treatment for head and neck cancers. Head of World Head & Neck Cancer Day on July 27, HNCII Founder and Chairman Dr. Sultan A. Pradhan said in a media workshop in Mumbai that delayed diagnosis remains one of the biggest challenges in cancer care despite significant advances in treatment.

The HNCII campaign seeks to create awareness about early warning signs such as

non-healing mouth ulcers, painless neck lumps, persistent difficulty in swallowing, voice changes and other unusual symptoms, encouraging people to undergo timely screening, diagnostic tests and treatment.

People often ignore symptoms, postpone consultations or delay treatment after diagnosis," Dr. Pradhan said. "Our message is simple—if something is not right, get it checked. In cancer, delay is the real killer."

HNCII said its long-term

goal is to reverse the current trend of late diagnosis.

HNCII, which specialises in the treatment of oral, thyroid, skull base brain, and spine tumours, has partnered with the Cancer Patients Aid Association (CPAA), Indian Cancer Society (ICS), the dental fraternity and other organisations. The campaign will use community outreach programmes, educational material, digital platforms and healthcare professional engagement to spread awareness across the country.

CBI secures return of two fugitives from UAE, Saudi

The CBI has secured the deportation of Red Notice subject Avinash Arjun Rathod from the UAE to India, in coordination with the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) and the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA).

Rathod is wanted in connection with a case involving large-scale financial fraud. He was brought to Mumbai on Thursday and was taken into custody by the Maharashtra Police. Earlier, a Red Notice was put published against Rathod through INTERPOL.

A CBI official alleged that Rathod, in a criminal conspiracy with others, induced investors to invest in multiple

schemes by falsely promising fixed monthly returns. Rathod dishonestly misappropriated the funds and diverted the proceeds through multiple bank accounts and demat accounts," the official said.

The CBI also said it has secured the deportation of Red Notice subject M u h a m m e d A l i Kanneer Palliyalil from Saudi Arabia in a separate case. Palliyalil was wanted by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) for unlawful activities and murder.

CBI said it got a Red Notice published against Palliyalil



through INTERPOL. Palliyalil was located in Saudi Arabia and arrested by the Saudi authorities. Thereafter an extradition request was sent to the authorities.

The CBI secured the deportation in coordination with the MEA, MHA and the NIA.

The agency alleged that the fugitive, who had assembled with deadly weapons and associates, eventually trespassed into the shop of a victim.

W o n g f u l l y restrained him and inflicted grievous injuries by using lethal weapons and killed him.

PMC to oversee 272 schools

The Maharashtra government has approved the establishment of an Urban Cluster Resource Centre bringing all schools within the Panchayat Municipal Corporation's (PMC) jurisdiction under its direct administrative control from the first instance.

The approval will enable the PMC education department to oversee 272 schools in the municipal area, bringing 1.75 lakh students in the direct purview of the urban body's education department. The city's education administration will no longer function under the Panchayat Samiti framework. The state has also sanctioned it in order to operationalise the new administrative setup.

₹7.89 cr lost to digital arrest

Cyber fraudsters posing as Delhi Police allegedly duped a 73-year-old tutor and travel operator from Andheri of Rs 7.89 crore. The FIR said that the accused kept the victim under 'digital arrest' from July 3 to July 18 by accusing him of involvement in money laundering. They claimed his Aadhaar card had been used to open a bank account linked to money laundering and told him he was under investigation in connection with a Nareish Goyal case. The accused instructed him to transfer his mutual funds, fixed deposits and bank deposits to their accounts.

GRP nabs pistol wielding train robber with 40 cases in state

The Dadar Government Railway Police (GRP) have arrested a Mumbai resident for allegedly brandishing a revolver and robbing railway passengers across states, by fraudulently exchanging their ATM cards. The GRP also seized a car and 48 ATM cards of various banks from the possession of the accused, identified as Nalaspotra resident Rohit Pandey.

Officials said that about 40 cases have been registered against Pandey at police stations in Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Varanasi, Mirzapur, Simrathpur, and other places.

The GRP said that it received a complaint from a traveller on the Bengaluru-Jodhpur Express in March. The complainant alleged that when the train reached Vasai Road, the accused brandished a revolver and snatched his bag containing ₹15 lakh. Subsequently, Mumbai Railway Police Commissioner Rakesh Kalasagar ordered a probe.

The GRP found that four other persons were allegedly involved in the crime. Police said the main accused, Pandey, had switched off his mobile phone, making it difficult to trace him. But after tracking down his friends and gathering technical intelligence, the police arrested Pandey on July 18.

ISKCON Pandharpur unveils 3 metre tall mechanical elephant

FDA targets Kalyan clinic, illegal abortion pills in Maha

The Maharashtra Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has seized illegal drug stocks worth lakhs of rupees, including allopathic medicines at a Kalyan clinic.

The FDA has intensified its crackdown on the illegal drug trade, confiscated manufacture and sale of medicines, mislabelled products, and the unauthorised sale of abortion pills. Raids were conducted across Mumbai, Kalyan, Nagpur, Akola and Kolhapur.

A joint team of the FDA and the Health Department raided Mrs. Prakash Poly Clinic in Kalyan on July 21 and seized allopathic medicines worth ₹1.03 lakh stocked without a valid drug sales licence.

FDA officials also raided Mrs. Jayman Industries in Kolhapur on July 22 and seized illegal Hand Cleanser allegedly being manufactured without the mandatory production licence. Products worth ₹1 lakh were confiscated and samples collected.

Illegal abortion drugs worth Rs 4.14 were seized from an unlicensed operator in Akola, while officials overhauled misbranded Ayurvedic medicines worth ₹6,000 in Ichalkaranji in Kolhapur.

Criminal cases have been filed under various laws.

Faith, fear and finances: ED maps Kharat's wealth trail

According to the agency, Kharat admitted that Pune-based businessman and politician Rajendra Jasud spent more than ₹3 crore on its construction.

Investigators found invoices were raised in Jasud's name and that of his company instead of Kharat's. Kharat allegedly said he did not know why and denied instructing anyone to issue them that way. The ED

alleges Kharat was kept under Kharat's influence by instilling fear of death, which was exploited for financial benefits.

Kharat also admitted that a Mercedes-Benz bought by Jasud was later transferred to his name without payment. Jasud allegedly financed nearly 10 foreign trips and paid for Kharat's overseas medical treatment. Kharat maintained these were voluntary acts of devotion.

The ED also examined Kharat's 2023 purchase of 1 hectare and 67 R of agricultural land at Nigoh village for ₹8.92 crore in his and his wife's names. He said ₹5.92 crore was paid through banking channels and

Kharat denied coercing followers and maintained that donations and financial aid from devotees were voluntary acts of faith.

reflected in the registered sale deed, while ₹3.90 crore was paid in cash on the registration day.

As his wife was unavailable on the rescheduled registration date, Kharat allegedly executed a General Power of Attorney in favour of associate Arvind Bawake.

The ED confronted him with an FIR in which original landowner Ramesh Nanaiahb Gondkar alleged that he had approached Kharat for a ₹3 crore loan but was fraudulently induced into transferring the land. Kharat denied the allegation.

To explain the purchase funds, Kharat said he borrowed ₹2.33 crore from Lalit Popale and received ₹4.25 crore through RTGS from Harshad Popale. The ED said both men later alleged they transferred the money under fear and pressure after

Kharat warned them of adverse spiritual consequences if they did not comply.

Kharat described the transactions as genuine loans, while the ED alleges they were funds obtained through extortion disguised as religious and spiritual obligations. He has denied the allegation.

The agency also questioned Kharat over bank transactions involving several crore. He attributed the credit to agricultural income, onion and soybean trading, property transactions, loans to relatives and repayments from acquaintances, but allegedly failed to produce supporting documents.

The prosecution complaint accuses Kharat of laundering ₹42.88 crore allegedly generated through extortion, cheating and criminal intimidation of devotees. The ED alleges the proceeds were layered through multiple bank accounts and invested in land, residential properties, vehicles, jewellery and other assets.

Kharat has denied covering followers and maintained that donations, gifts and financial assistance from devotees were voluntary acts of faith.
